We have been having some much fun in Reception, going on lots of different adventures as we explore different types of transport.

As we come to the end of our topic we are looking forward to our London Bus Trip, next week, which will allow us all to go on our very own adventure - on a Vintage Double Decker Bus! We will use this as inspiration to make our own Naughty Bus stories, create maps of where and what we saw and even make our very own buses.

Recently, we have spent some time developing our writing, thinking about how we construct a sentence and use our developing sound knowledge to segment and write words. It has been amazing to see the children's confidence grow as they explore their own writing with more independence and we cannot wait to see that the next few weeks and months bring.

In our Maths learning, we have recently been exploring numbers 6-10, building our umber bond knowledge to develop our fluency and recall with these facts. We are beginning to explore more complex ideas such as making pairs, odds and evens and sharing.

What's happening in Year 1...

The children are no coming to the end of their 'Destination Outer Space' topic and have thoroughly enjoyed their learning at school. Last Monday, the children got to experience an exciting Virtual Reality workshop where they explored space! We do hope they went home and told you all about it. In DT, the children have created some fantastic designs for their moon buggy and over the course of the next two weeks will be making and reviewing them. In Art, the children will be working with clay to create their own aliens and will develop their skills to manipulate the clay and carve and join pieces together. In Maths, the children will begin focusing on place value within 50. They will confidently learn to count on and back, identifying one more and one less and placing numbers on a number line. The children will also be focusing on making groups of ten and ones which will help them as they develop their multiplication and division understanding.

Our English learning this half term has spanned nonfiction and fiction writing. The children, having explored the text 'Beegu', will now be creating their own versions of the story with a change of event and/or character. Throughout January, the children have been focusing on the PSHE topic, dreams and goals. In the days before half term, the children will be learning about overcoming obstacles and celebrating success. Alongside this, they will continue to focus on the feelings associated with the challenges or experiences they may have.

Phonics

The children will be working through the Phases in their Phonics groups: Phase 3 Phase 3-4 Phase 4 Phase 5 Please talk to your child about the sounds they are learning - these can

be found in their reading diary.

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What's happening in Year 2...

We have had an amazing start to this term. The children have been learning all about the rainforests and working hard preparing and performing for their class assemblies! We have also spent a day learning all about Chinese New Year and discovered lots of new facts about rabbits!

Over the next two weeks, we will continue investigating decomposition in Science and complete our ,'What Rots?' investigation. So far we have observed big changes in fruit and vegetables and little or no changes in plastic packaging, paper and glass. We will be thinking about what this tells us about the impact of human life on the environment.

We are looking forward to our visit to Kew Gardens and are very excited to see some plants that would normally be found in tropical zones around the world. We will be looking at maps before we go and writing questions and sentences about Kew.

In Maths we will be working on multiplication and also celebrating numbers in Number Day on Wednesday 1st.
