This half term we will be revisiting all of our school values, with a particular focus on what these values mean and look like as we prepare for change.

Often, with change, children experience a range

- 1. Become aware of emotion. Especially if it is low intensity (such as disappointment or frustration).
- 2. Connect. View their emotions as opportunities for connection and teaching.
- 3. Accept. Listen and accept their emotions: avoid judgement.
- 4. Reflect. Help them use words to describe what they feel.
- End stage. If appropriate, help them to problem solve. You may also communicate that all wishes and feelings are acceptable, but some behaviours are not.

of emotions, from excitement to apprehensions. This half term we will be exploring these emotions as well as supporting the children to develop a range of strategies to support self-regulation. We will be using our 'Emotion Coaching' approach to support.

# **RSE Curriculum**

## Summer Uniform





### What's been happening in Reception ...

This week we have launched into our final topic in Reception by going on a magical carpet ride around the world. Throughout this term we will be visiting 6 of the 7 continents to learn about animals, homes, clothes and music around the world, thinking about how they are similar or different to Woking!

Throughout this topic we will be exploring the different continents so that we can name them and we will also be creating our own maps to consider where we live in relation to the world. Using beebots we will epxlore how maps are really important to help us navigate the world around us.

In Maths we will be consolidating our learning on the key skills of counting, subitising, compositions, sorting and matching, comparing and ordering. We will be providing regular opportunities for the children to practise counting on to 20 and beyond. We will continue to understand that all quantities are composed of smaller quantities and look at doubling, sharing and grouping. We will also practise being able to recall number facts to 10.



#### What's been happening in Year 1

We have launched our new topic 'Knights and Castles' and over the coming weeks we will be increasing our knowledge of castles in preparation for our school visit to Windsor Castle.

The children will be learning about the history of castles and the different types of castles that were built in the past. They will be designing, making and evaluating their own castles in their DT lessons, focusing on a castle's features. In geography, the children will be focusing on the countries and capital cities in the UK and where we are in the world.

Our Science learning will focus on materials, their properties and suitability for what they are used for. There will be a lot of vocabulary we will be exploring, for example: flexible, rigid, dull, absorbent, waterproof etc. The children will then be researching how bricks are made.


In Maths, the children will be focusing on measures which includes learning about coins and money and telling the time. At home, you could explore these Maths topics practically with your child, for example keeping a diary of your day and what time you do things and recognising and counting up the coins in your purse/wallet.



#### **Phonics**
