

Please ensure you have collected your child / children and left the school premises by 3.30 pm.


The gates will then be locked to enable after school clubs to run safely.

What's happening in Reception...

The children thoroughly enjoyed our topic last half term "Anyone can be a Hero" - especially the visit by the Police who told us about how they help people to keep people safe. We got to dress up in some police uniform and see inside their car!

We have seen some fantastic Go for It Gorillas over the last month, well done everyone! We have discussed all the characteristics now. See if your child can remember when they were showing these behaviours. We saw some Creative Chameleons last week with our firework activities.



The return to school sees our new topic starting "Seasons and Celebrations". We began this topic by discussing Bonfire night, why it is celebrated and how to be safe around fireworks. We also celebrated Diwali and found out that it is also called 'The Festival of Light'. We will celebrate Friendship Week and the 'Power for Good' before moving on to our new book 'The Leaf Thief'. In PSHE we are celebrating differences, thinking about how we are special and unique as well as how we are the same.

We are trying hard to write some CVC words with the sounds we have learnt e.g. cat, hop, sit. Have a go at writing some words at home too!

We have been focusing on counting accurately and using our super subitising skills (don't count, say the amount). Play a game with a dice at home and see if you can subitise the number!

What's happening in Year 1...

The children have been introduced to the new topic for this half term, 'Fill up, Fuel up.'

We have started by zooming in on fruits and exploring all the adjectives we can use to describe how they look, feel and taste. In Science we will be learning about plants and will grow cress, observing it over time.

In DT, the children will be learning to design, make and evaluate their own food products. They will be taste testing fruits and will decide what they would like to include in their fruit salad.

We will begin the half term with the text, The Gigantic Turnip and the children will learn about the story's structure and the adjectives used for description. They will then use drama to help them retell the story before writing their own story.

In Geography, we will be developing our map reading skills and will revisit the continents and oceans. We will also be comparing where we live to St Lucia and will learn about its climate and what grows there.

Our PSHE this half term is focusing on celebrating differences, including what makes us special and how we can all be a good friend and show kindness to others.

We have an exciting month of learning all about travel ahead of us including a trip to Brooklands Museum on Monday 17th November.


In Maths, we will be learning how to add and subtract a one digit number from a two digit number and a two digit number from another two digit number and will be using our knowledge of number bonds to 10 and 20 to help us.

In English, we will be using the story, 'Pedal Power' to inspire us to create posters informing others about the benefits of riding more bikes.

We will then be using the story, 'Taking Flight' as a starting point to help us learn about the Wright Brothers and to sequence key events.

In Science, we will be learning about keeping healthy and healthy diets. In History, we will be learning about how aeroplanes have changed over time and, in Art, we will be learning a variety of drawing techniques.
