We have so much to celebrate with you already. The children have continued to do themselves proud by immersing themselves fully into their new learning and settling into the routines of everyday life here at School. They are displaying superb learning behaviors and have been exploring a range of self regulation techniques to support themselves to be ready to learn.

All year groups are now fully immersed in their new topics and key texts in which our learning is based around.

Reception's topic is called 'We are not scared to walk with dinosaurs.' The children have been using a keen interest in dinosaurs to explore their new school environment.

In Year 1 the children are on an 'Underwater Adventure' - exploring the different seas and oceans of the world and the animals that live there. In Year 2 'Master Makers' is the title of their learning topic. They have been exploring the properties of materials and a range of local artists and sculptures using the story 'Tin Forest ' as a starting point.

We begin each topic using our learning cycle. You may have seen it when you have popped into the classrooms. The children spend time sharing what they already know, what they want to find out, how they are going to find it out



before sharing what they did find out. You can find out more about the learning that will be taking place in each year group on the year group pages of the newsletter or on our school website. We have been busy updating our website to provide you with as much information as possible about life here at The Horsell Village School.

Whole school priorities for 2022 to 2023

Over the last few years we have worked hard to continue to develop our teaching and learning approach. We have introduced our learning cycle, characteristics of an effective learner, the learning tree and launched our school motto. All have become an integral part of everyday life here at The Horsell Village School. We continue to teach through key texts, focusing on supporting our children to develop a broad vocabulary bank.

This year through exploring responses from parent, staff and pupils surveys as well as end of year outcomes and discussions with the Local Governors Committee, we have identified 4 key objectives. All objectives link back to our 3 Year Strategic aims.

Objective 1- To further develop teaching and learning practices, focusing on challenge for all.

Objective 2- To actively involve all stakeholders in developing the very best educational experience for all children.

Objective 3- To further develop coaching practice across the school to continue to improve teaching and learning.

Objective 4- To further develop opportunities for oracy development across the whole school community.

Covid-19 Update

Covid-19 continues to have a presence in our school community. At school we continue to implement strategies to help minimise the risk. The children have access to hand sanitation stations throughout school and we continue to promote good hygiene practices.



Current NHS guidance if a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test.

Once they feel well enough to do so and they do not have a high temperature they can return to school on day four.

For staff, should they test positive current guidance is 5 days self-isolation. As always we will try to keep disruption to a minimum and provide cover using staff within school. As a a inclusive school community all staff are familiar to all children.

Please ensure earrings are removed before sending your child into school after the half term.


Mental Health Awareness Week 10th to the 14th October


What's been happening in Reception ...

It has been a wonderful start to Reception this year, all the children have settled into school life brilliantly and are enjoying the school days.

What's been happening in Year 1.


Year I have had a wonderful start to the new school year and have quickly settled into the Year I routines. Our topic this half term, 'Underwater Adventure', has inspired the children to want to find out more about the World's oceans and what lives in them.

We have been using a range of rich texts as a starting point for the children's learning. The children have particularly enjoyed reading the text 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' which tells the eventful journey made by Stanley, a discarded plastic carrier bag, who is swept into the sea. The children have been reflecting on the impact of plastic pollution and have been learning about persuasive techniques to help them to get people to reduce, reuse and recycle.

There has been a focus on place-value, in Maths, and the children have been counting on and back from given numbers. They will be going on to order and compare numbers and will also be learning their number bonds to 10 to help them to complete addition and subtraction facts.

At home, please continue to support your child with their individual letter formation, referring to the Letter Mat for Handwriting document on the Year 1 page of the school's website.

What's been happening in Year 2 ...

In Year 2 we have started our new topic, 'Master Makers', which is all about how things are created and the skills that we need to become master makers ourselves. This includes making stories of our own, creating paper sculptures or making predictions in Science in order to take our learning further or create an investigation.

We were very proud of how well the children represented our school on our recent sculpture walks. They used their observational skills expertly to spot all the sculptures that we have in Woking and asked lots of questions about how and why they were made.

We participated in this year's 'Harvest Live' and joined farmer Hannah who showed us how her fields of wheat were grown, harvested and milled.

As an enrichment to our topic, we are excited to be taking part in den building sessions soon. A bushcraft and wilderness living instructor will be helping us to learn about how to make strong, waterproof shelters.

Our books for this term include The Tin Forest by Helen Ward and The Iron man. by Ted Hughes. If you get a chance to visit Woking library, you might like to see if you can find the books to also share at home.
